

MARCH HIGHLIGHTS WORSHIP AND SUNDAY SCHOOL AT 9 AND 11 AM

9 AM: Spirited Traditional Worship features hymns, choir anthems, and organ and piano music.

SUNDAY, MARCH 6: On this first Sunday of the month, we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion and welcome new members into the church family. At 11 AM, Quinn, Grey and T.J. Matteson will be baptized. Dr. Brill's communion meditation, "A Story of Human Weakness," is based upon Luke 15:11-32.


